2019 CoC Competition

• The NC BoS CoC has over 10.4 million in homeless funding at stake in the 2019 CoC Competition.

Potential Amount Available to NC BoS CoC Applicants:

Annual Renewal Demand (ARD)	\$8,583,575
Bonus Funding	\$766,205
DV Bonus	\$1,164,839
CoC Planning (not ranked)	\$349,452
Projects will be ranked within 2 tiers:	
Tier 1: 100% of first-time renewals + 94% of ARD	\$8,085,723

- Project applications must be placed into two tiers:
 - HUD has indicated that Tier 1 is the relatively "safe" tier, and projects placed in Tier 1 are likely to receive funding from HUD.
 - Tier 2 is the riskier tier, and projects placed in Tier 2 may or may not receive funding. In the past, the NC Balance of State CoC has had projects placed in Tier 2 that did not receive funding from HUD.

NCCEH staff are finalizing initial draft and attachments for the CoC Application.

- Staff need further information to answer new questions in the CoC Application:
 - Does anyone have a written agreement with a local Workforce Development Board that helps people experiencing homelessness access employment?
 - Marie Watson stated Johnston Lee Harnett Community Action has a MOU with their Workforce Development Board.
 - Does anyone have a written agreement with state or local education or training organization that prioritizes access to education or training opportunities?



- Marie Watson state Johnston Lee Harnett Community Action has a MOU with the local community college.
- Has any region promoted partnerships and access to employment opportunities such as job fairs, outreach to employers, or partnership with staffing agencies?
 - Teena Willis stated that Hickory has a new initiative with the soup kitchen and a car dealership to provide transportation for people to get to work. This is in a pilot stage now.
 - Marie Watson stated Johnston Lee Harnett Community Action has a partnership with a local manufacturer to hire their clients.
 - Melissa McKeown stated Union County Community Shelter has a partnership with the Community College to provide essential skills training for manufacturing jobs. She also stated a partnership with manufacturers that host job fairs quarterly.
- Has your region worked with public or private agencies to find volunteer opportunities for people experiencing homelessness?
 - Melissa McKeown stated Union County Community Shelter partners with DSS when they have the Christmas Bureau so clients can volunteer for set-up or gift distribution.

Project Recommendations from the Project Review Committee

Projects ranked as follows:

- HMIS & SSO-Coordinated Entry Renewals ranked first and second.
 - o Community-wide projects for required CoC infrastructure
 - Applied for by NCCEH
 - Scorecard not designed to measure
- Renewal Projects
 - Pull down renewal applications that do not meet Housing First and Key Elements/Benchmark Standards
 - Pull down programs that did not meet Housing First first and then programs that missed Key Elements/Benchmark Standards
 - Then sort in order of score
- New RRH Projects
 - o New RRH projects performed better than SHAHC renewal projects & ranked higher.
 - o Trillium: \$200,087
 - o NC DHHS: \$763,919
- NCCADV DV Bonus Projects



- o Ranked at the bottom because ranking will not affect its chances for DV Bonus
- o Increasing RRH for NC DV Survivors
 - Potential Funding \$924,283
- Increasing CE for NC DV Survivors
 - Potential Funding \$239,035
- Staff displayed the final CoC Project Priority Listing.
- Staff intends to submit the CoC Consolidated Application by September 27th, which means they
 will publicly post the final application and Project Priority Listing on the NCCEH website on
 September 24th. Staff will send an email to NC BoS CoC stakeholders when it is posted.


