# COVID-19 Response



# NCCEH working to coordinate a statewide response to the COVID-19 pandemic

- Convening people and information as best practices emerge nationally. Distributing information to leaders.
- Supporting leaders and providers in BoS regions to implement preparations and procedures to respond effectively and keep clients and staff safe.
- Working with state and federal partners and local leaders to prepare for federal stimulus money through the CARES Act



# Top priorities for initial response to COVID-19 in the homelessness system:

1) Safety and Health Supplies for Emergency Shelter and Unsheltered: Meet CDC guidelines for homeless shelters to keep people healthy Support the health of people living in unsheltered settings

2) Medical Shelter:

Provide quarantine and isolation options for people who are symptomatic or who test positive for COVID-19

Provide recovery or care options for patients experiencing homelessness to receive care for other health issues to preserve hospital beds

3) Housing Stabilization:

Move people out of homelessness and into housing so they can follow social distancing and hygiene guidelines to reduce the spread

Keep people at-risk of homelessness in safe housing with the ability to stay-at-home

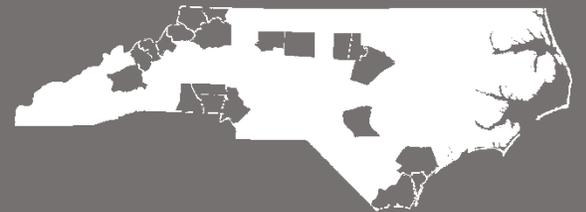

# CoC Competition Updates



# HUD made full FY19 CoC award announcements.

- HUD released full FY19 CoC awards on March 13<sup>th</sup>
  - All Tier 1 projects were awarded
  - 1 new project funded: Trillium RRH in Region 13 at \$198,767
  - 1 renewal project defunded: SHAHC PSH in Surry County
  - CoC planning grant funded at \$349,452
  - Neither DV Bonus project was funded
  - Total initial award: \$8,941,246
- Contracts for FY19 CoC grants will be executed in the coming few months
  - For grantees with expiring grants early in the year, contact the HUD Field Office to expedite your contracts.



# The initial phases of the FY20 CoC competition have started.

HUD announced the initial steps of the FY20 CoC competition:

- Registration – reviewed and approved by HUD
- GIW – delayed
- NOFA release – delayed

NCCEH staff have begun preparations for this year's competition:

- Renewal Applicant slide deck with helpful hints
- First Submission-Renewal Applicants: CY19 HMIS APRs due March 31, 2020
- Intent to Apply process launched



# Intent to Apply form mandatory for all agencies applying for new CoC funds

Intent to Apply form have been posted to the NCCEH website at:

- Any agency wanting to apply for a new CoC project in the FY20 competition is required to submit a form.
- Asks for preliminary information about proposed project(s)
- NCCEH staff will review and follow-up with the agency to discuss
  - *NOTE: Due to COVID-19 response, we will likely begin calls with agencies starting in late April/early May*

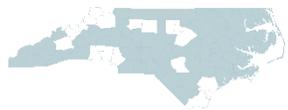


# CoC needs agencies to apply for funds that can run effective programs.

Regional Committee leadership and at-large members can help recruit agencies to apply.

The CoC needs agencies with:

- Capacity to operate CoC programs
- Best practice knowledge
- Willingness to serve the most vulnerable people experiencing homelessness



# The Funding and Performance Subcommittee recommend FY20 CoC Funding Priorities for consideration.

FPS reviewed FY19 CoC Funding Priorities document and made updates reflecting the HUD's and CoC's current priorities.

# The Funding and Performance Subcommittee recommend FY20 CoC Funding Priorities for consideration.

Overall priorities remain the same:

- *Ensure essential infrastructure elements are in place, including HMIS and CE*
- *Ensure adequate coverage of PSH across the CoC*
- *Increase the availability of RRH*
- *Ensure CoC funding is being used well, including potentially re-allocating some funding from projects that have patterns of low spending or poor performance*



# The Funding and Performance Subcommittee recommend FY20 CoC Funding Priorities for consideration.

## Updates in the FY20 CoC Funding Priorities

- Updated dates
- Added detail to procedure for ranking projects and approval by Steering Committee
- Included more explanation of how DV Bonus funding would be considered
  - DV Bonus SSO-CE projects should cover the whole CoC and provide better access to current CE system
- Removed sentence that no longer applies about ranking renewals above all new projects
- Updated New Project Priority Grid

# Scorecard Committee activities will be delayed.

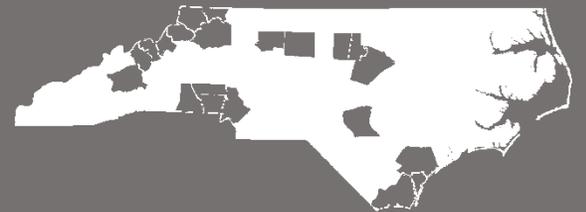
Scorecard Committee recommends both renewal and new applicant scorecards for the CoC competition.

Because of the need to respond to the current COVID-19 crisis, we will be postponing the start of the committee's work.

# 2020 Anti-Discrimination Policies and Procedures

- These policies and procedures aim to ensure safety, dignity, and well-being of all individuals and families served by programs in the NC BoS CoC.
- The NC BoS CoC's Anti-Discrimination Policies and Procedures apply to staff, volunteers, and contractors at all partner agencies.
  - Mandatory for agencies that receive CoC and ESG funding



# What's in the Anti-Discrimination Policy?

- Anti-Discrimination Policy includes procedures for:
  - NC BoS CoC
  - Agencies
  - Staff, Volunteers, and Contractors
- Sub-policies within document:
  - Transgender and Gender Nonconforming Policies and Procedures
  - Family Separation Policy
  - Faith-Based Activities Policy
  - Grievance and Anti-Retaliation Policy and Procedures
- Agencies shall incorporate the language used in the NC BoS CoC Anti-Discrimination Policies and Procedures into their own Policies and Procedures



# Appendix II: Checklist Questions

- Does your agency have an Anti-Discrimination policy?
- Is there a stated plan to train new staff and clearly communicate this policy during the onboarding process? Is annual training provided for staff, volunteers, and contractors?
- Does the intake process include a copy of the agency's Anti-Discrimination policies to clients or people presenting for services.
- Does the Policy Refer to Department of Housing Urban and Development (HUD) Equal Access Rule, anti-discrimination and privacy laws, and all other federal, state, and local non-discrimination and privacy law?
- Is there a clear statement about non-discrimination because of race, ethnicity, color, national origin, language, ancestry, religion, sex, familial status, age, gender identity, LGBTQ+ status, marital status, domestic or sexual violence victim status, or sensory, mental, or physical disability?



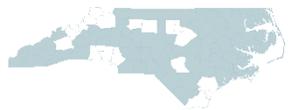
# Checklist Questions cont'd

- Is there an equal access policy?
  - If there is an equal access policy: Does it include specific procedures for working with transgender and gender nonconforming persons?
- Is there a family separation policy?
- Is there a faith-based activities policy?
- Do procedures demonstrate how the clients, agency, staff, volunteers, and contractors will carry out the agency's anti-discrimination policies?
- Are there grievance and anti-retaliation policies and procedures?
  - If so, are they shared with each person presenting for services?

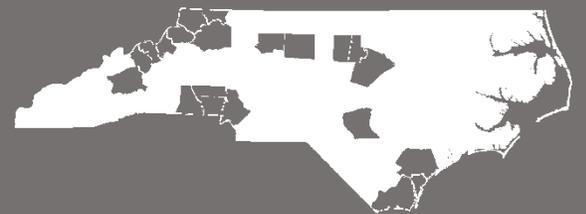

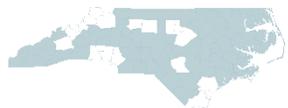

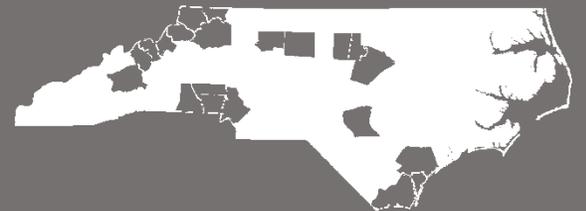


# Racial Equity Subcommittee Update

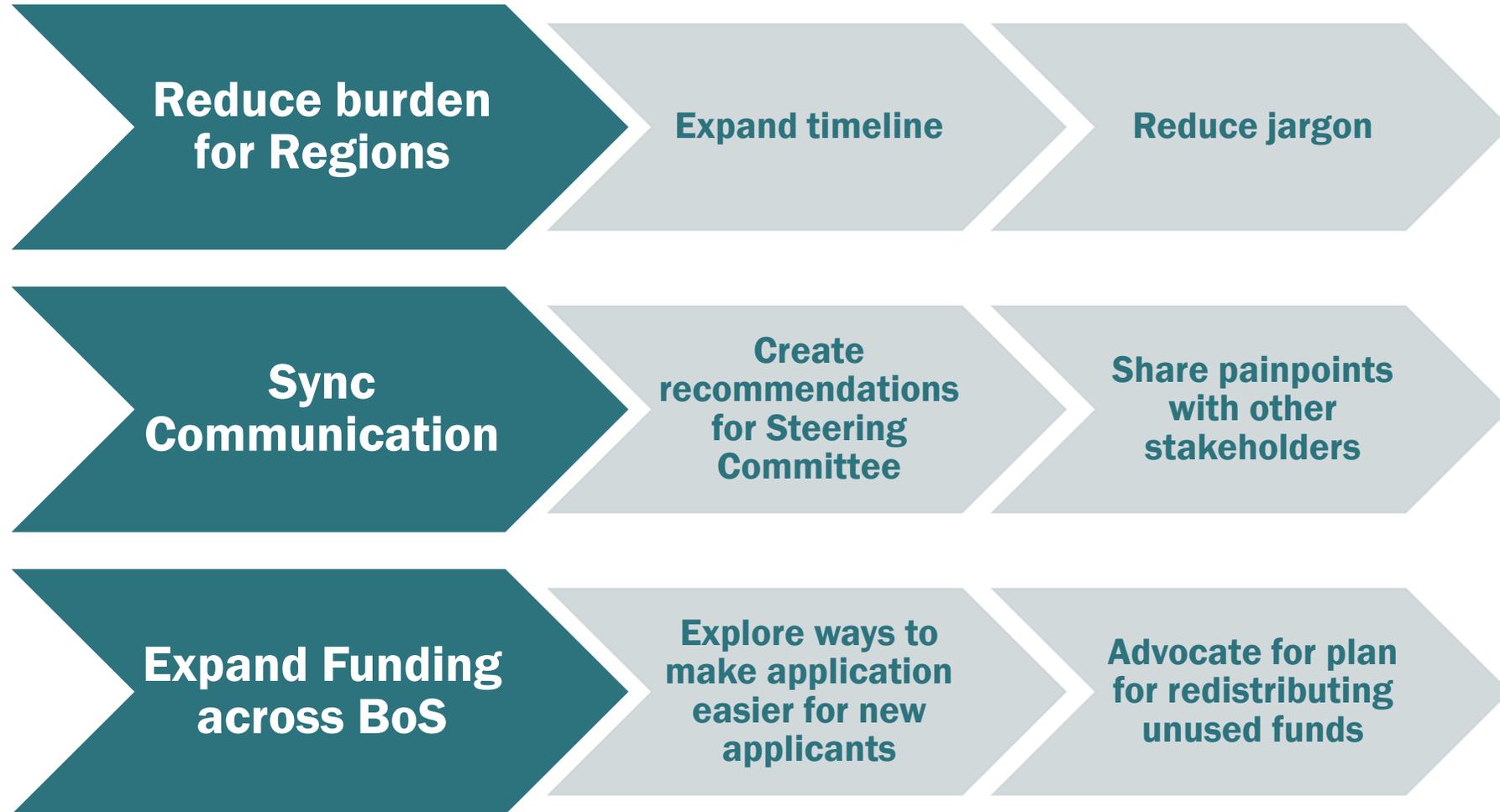

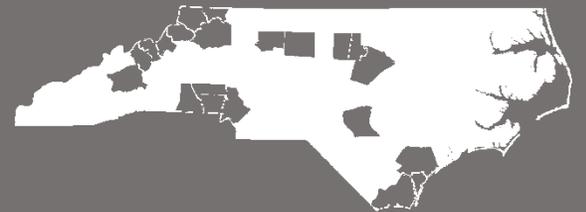
