



Letter of Support Request

Rowan Helping Ministries' Veterans Affairs' Grant Per Diem

Helping Homeless Veterans Find Their Pathways Home

If awarded in 2023, this grant will allow the agency to continue partnering with the Salisbury VA Medical Center to provide transitional housing and supportive services to Veterans experiencing homelessness to return to permanent housing. Three years ago, Rowan Helping Ministries was awarded its first VA GPD/PDO grant to provide 10 beds – 8 male, 1 female, and 1 family unit. The male and female beds are located in a congregate shelter, and the family unit is located in the Eagle's Nest Transitional Housing apartments. Last year, the agency was awarded a \$450,000 grant from the VA GPD Capital Grant Program to support the construction of a third transitional housing facility on its campus.

10 GPD beds -

- 9 in a new transitional housing facility with private units
- 1 in an existing transitional housing facility

Veterans will be provided wrap-around supportive services including employment and educational opportunities, individual and group therapy, as well as community member support.

Veterans are referred through the Salisbury VA Medical Center, which encompasses 21 counties: Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Cabarrus, Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Gaston, Guilford, Iredell, Mecklenburg, Montgomery, Randolph, Rowan, Surry, Stanly, Stokes, Stanly, Union, Yadkin, and Wilkes.





Preparing for 2023 PIT/HIC

Point in Time and Housing Inventory Counts

One Night Counts each year on the last Wednesday of January:

• January 25th this year!





Why does this matter?

Important community data for funding, stakeholders, and governance

- Deep data: covers HMIS and non-HMIS projects
- Consistent data: completed every year
- Consequential data: used by HUD, ESG Office, and others to determine funding for regions
- Underreporting can lead to lost funding

Serves the most vulnerable people in our communities!



Combining Data & Reporting

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NCCEH Staff will combine data and submit to HUD.








Timelines & Deadlines: OPH Count

- Ensure information is complete and available for clients moved into units by 1/25/2023
- Respond to NCCEH with program, funding, bed/unit and capacity information by February 15th
