2: Review & Approve Minutes

- NCCEH Submitted January 31st
- \$4,820,155 in funding
- All renewal projects
- 5% cut came from 2 lowest performing transitional housing programs
 - 1 program to reduce families served
 - 1 program to change model
 - Preserved most funding within BoS



- 27 Permanent Supportive Housing Projects
 - \$3,442,713
- 6 Transitional Housing Project
 - \$858,143
- 1 HMIS Project
 - \$519,299

- NCCEH will send scorecards for each grant to applicants
- Call NCCEH for individual TA
- NCCEH will target lowest scoring projects
 - Performance Improvement Plans



- Strategic Planning Goals
 - Increase progress towards ending chronic homelessness
 - Increase housing stability
 - Increase project participants income
 - Increase the number of participants obtaining mainstream benefits
 - Use rapid re-housing as a method to reduce family homelessness
 - → Further discussion & planning at March 4th meeting



4: Data Usage Proposals

- Grant all existing CHIN license requests
 - Paid for by BoS through June 30, 2014
- Subject to BoS CHIN License Policy (to be revised?)

End User	200	170	30
Volunteer	21	14	7
ART	88	62	26



4: Data Usage Proposals, Cont.

- Reserve 9 end user licenses for rolling requests
- Use remaining unused licenses to target agencies
 - Not on HMIS
 - Most year-round, non-DV, non-hotel voucher beds
- No changes to volunteer licenses
- All agencies obtain and use ART license
- Data Usage Workgroup will begin work on 2014-2015
 CHIN license plan



4: Data Usage Proposals, Cont.

- SSVF programs pay for CHIN licenses
 - \$1170/license/year
 - Year ends June 30
- These licenses will not count towards BoS allocation of 200 end user licenses



Revise CHIN License Policy

- NC BoS has paid CHIN license fees for all existing CHIN users within Balance of State for July 1 2013 June 20,
 2014. In order to maintain this no-fee license, users must:
 - Log in at least once every 60 days
 - Maintain high data quality
 - Be responsive to outreach from CHIN and/or NCCEH
 - User or other agency representative must regularly participate (80% or better attendance) in his or her local Balance of State Regional Committee meetings
 - Enter all HUD required elements in CHIN



5: 2013 AHAR

- Annual report to U.S. Congress on extent and nature of homelessness in America
- Visualizes progress of federal strategic plan,
 Opening Doors
- Covers the entire USA
 - 420 Continuums of Care

AHAR Key Findings

- 610,042 homeless
 - 18% Chronically homeless
 - 9% Veterans
 - 14% BoS or statewide CoC
- MOST likely to be
 - 25 years or older (67%)
 - In emergency shelter (65%)
 - An individual (64%)
 - In a major city CoC (45%)



AHAR: The Good News

- Declines in homelessness since 2012
 - All homeless (4%)
 - Unsheltered homeless (7%)
 - Homeless individuals (2%)
 - Homeless persons in families (7%)
 - Chronic homelessness among individuals (7%)
 - Homeless veterans (8%)



5: AHAR, Cont.

• Opening Doors: Federal Strategic Plan to End Homelessness

Goal	Decline Observed
End chronic homelessness by 2015	16%
Prevent and end homelessness for families, youth, and children by 2020	8%
Prevent and end homelessness for Veterans by 2015	25%
Set a path to ending all types of homelessness	6%

7: Funding for Veterans

- The VA announced SSVF funds
 - \$300 million in FY 2014 & \$300 million in FY 2015
 - Rapid Rehousing model
 - Application due March 14, 2014

7: Funding for Veterans, Cont.

Priority	Definition	Funding	Renewable	Time Period
1	76 high-need CoCs (not Balance of State)	Up to \$300 million	N	3 years
2	Existing SSVF programs seeking renewals	Up to \$300 million	Y	1 or 3 years
3	Initial SSVF applicants	Remainder of available funding	Y	1 year

7: Funding for Veterans, Cont.

- Requirements/Restrictions
 - Cannot exceed \$2 million per year
 - Total number of supportive services grants awarded to a grantee cannot exceed 7 nationwide/year
 - Grants to the same applicant cannot have overlapping service areas
- Recommended: letter of support from CoC
 - Contact BoS if you plan to apply



7: Funding for Veterans, Cont.

- Department of Labor Veterans' Employment and Training Service (DOL-VETS) announced funding for local Stand Down events that help homeless veterans
 - \$600,000 available for approximately 70 events
 - \$10,000 per multi-day event (up to 3 days)
 - \$7,000 per one-day event
 - Accepting apps for events Oct 2014 Sept 2015
 - Submit at least 90 days prior to event
 - Grants awarded first-come, first-served until funding exhausted
