## DEFINITIONS OF TERMS

### Homeless

Only people who are **literally homeless** according to HUD's definition should be counted in the Point-in-Time Count. This means that on the night of the count, they are residing:

- In emergency shelter, including domestic violence shelters,
- In transitional housing for homeless persons who originally came from the streets or emergency shelters, or
- In places not meant for human habitation (cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus/train stations, streets, encampments).

### Sheltered/Unsheltered

- **Sheltered** homeless persons are residing in emergency shelter (including domestic violence shelters) or in transitional housing for homeless persons on the night of the count.
- **Unsheltered** homeless persons are residing in places not meant for human habitation on the night of the count, such as cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus/train stations, streets, or campgrounds.

### Chronically Homeless

- Definition: a homeless individual or a homeless family with an adult head of household who:
  - Has a disabling condition (serious mental illness, substance use disorder, developmental disability, physical disability)**AND**
  - Has been homeless and living in a place not meant for human habitation or an emergency shelter continuously for at least 1 year or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years
