3: More in My Basket

- NC Cooperative Extension
 - Located at land grant universities throughout USA
 - Two university locations in NC
 - NC State University
 - NC A&T State University
 - Extension agents located in all 100 NC counties
 - Each agent provides resources for their local community



- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Outreach
 - USDA-funded
 - Purpose: Implement strategies to inform and educate potentially eligible low-income people not currently participating in SNAP about
 - Nutrition benefits of the program
 - Significant impact of receiving benefits
 - Eligibility rules
 - How to apply
 - States submit a SNAP-Outreach plan annually



- MIMB Purpose
 - 1. Reduce barriers & increase participation in SNAP
 - Community Education Participants learn about
 - Eligibility requirements
 - How SNAP can help purchase more food & healthier food
 - How to apply
 - 2. Individualized Outreach staff can
 - Answer questions about SNAP
 - Complete quick screening to determine eligibility
 - Complete SNAP application





- Program Delivery
 - Group presentations
 - Highlights SNAP program features and benefits
 - Lasts approximately 30-45 minutes
 - Booths
 - FNS/SNAP information displays at fairs, festivals, etc.
 - Information about *MIMB* application assistance provided
 to families who visit the booth





- Program Delivery, Cont.
 - Individual Consultations
 - Typically during Medicare part D enrollment
 - Agents share 3 minute brief overview of MIMB and assistance available



- Screening & Application Assistance
 - Conducted by MIMB office staff
 - Individualized Outreach
 - Multiple ways to reach participants
 - Can be offered on-site in conjunction with programs
 - Participants can call toll-free number for assistance
 - Program office contacts interested participants

4: ESG Update

- Unspent funds from 2012 returned to communities
 - \$308,536 in 10 communities
 - Must be spent by June 30, 2014
 - Community vote on distribution
 - Current ESG grantee
- ESG training update



5: HMIS RFP

- CHIN Governance Committee released a Request for Proposal on February 21
 - New administrative agency to manage North Carolina's statewide HMIS system (now called CHIN)
- RFP timeline
 - March 31: Letters of intent were due
 - May 16: Applications due
 - June: Interviews with top candidates
 - July: HMIS Administrative Agency comment operation
 - January: Target date

- NCCEH compiling BoS PIT data
 - PIT Count conducted January 29
 - Next steps:
 - BoS CoC-wide and county totals released
 - http://www.ncceh.org/PITdata/
 - Finalized Housing Inventory Chart (HIC)
 - Inventory of all beds in CoC serving people who are homeless
 - HIC and PIT data entered into Homeless Data Exchange (HDX)
 - HUD requirement
 - Due April 30
