Supportive Housing Funding Available

Supportive housing funding from NC Housing Finance Agency

- NCHFA announced funding availability in December
- Purposes of program
 - Increase supply of permanent supportive housing in most integrated setting appropriate to needs of proposed residents
 - Serve adults and children with special needs earning less than 60% area median income (AMI)
 - Preference for those at or below 30% AMI
 - Provide affordable and accessible housing with links to appropriate services and supports for persons with special needs
 - Provide funds to leverage other public and private resources
 - Improve the quality, safety and accessibility of housing for the homeless
 - Preserve existing NCHFA-financed supportive housing



Preference for projects that help to meet Olmstead Settlement goals

- Independent rental units where no more than 20% of units required by funders to be restricted for persons with disabilities
- All rental developments which contribute to the Olmstead Agreement will be eligible to receive NCHFA-funded Key Program rental assistance on restricted units
- Eligible projects will include conversion of properties with an active or former Adult Care Home license into independent supportive apartments
 - Contribute to the Olmstead Agreement goals
 - Meet all other SHDP requirements



NCHFA SHDP funds new construction and rehab for a variety of projects

- 3+ units of PSH
- Service programs that provide housing for residents
 - Substance use treatment
 - Group homes for children
- Emergency shelter rehab or replacement
- Refinancing to preserve existing NCHFA-financed supportive housing
 - Structural improvements for accessibility, energy efficiency, health and safety
- Renovation of emergency or transitional housing into PSH
- Reuse of existing adult care homes into permanent supportive apartments
- Renovation of existing supportive housing to come into compliance with building codes

Foothills Regional Committee Coordinated Assessment Plan

- Regional Committee did a good job incorporating CAC feedback into plan revisions
- Extensive connections to existing community systems
- Complete listing of program rules



Lee-Harnett Regional Committee Coordinated Assessment Plan

- Regional Committee reformed during plan process
 - 2 Regional Committees → 1
- Straightforward 2-county plan
- Discussion, motion to approve

Point-in-Time Count

2016 Point-in-Time Count will be night of Wednesday, January 27

- PIT is a statistically reliable, de-duplicated count of homeless people
- One of the main sources of data on homelessness (other is HMIS)
- HUD requires all CoCs to conduct annual count
- During the count, also collect info for Housing Inventory Chart (HIC)
 - Program info & bed inventory
 - Includes RRH and PSH programs



Who gets counted during the PIT?

- People who are literally homeless according to HUD's definition
- 1) In emergency shelter (including domestic violence shelters)
- 2) In transitional housing dedicated for homeless people
- 3) In unsheltered situations
 - Sleeping on streets, park benches, bus/train stations
 - Camping out (in woods, under bridges, etc.)
 - Sleeping in cars
- Do NOT count: doubled-up, substandard housing, people in institutions (hospitals, jails, residential treatment programs)



Regional Committees plan and conduct local count

- Planning work should be in progress now
 - Getting agencies involved who need to do sheltered count
 - Planning locations for unsheltered count & training volunteers
 - Distributing forms to agencies/people doing count
 - Advertising count so homeless people know it's happening
- Follow-up done after the count
 - Collecting completed forms, de-duplicating, and reviewing them for correctness
 - Submitting forms to NCCEH by deadline

NCCEH Data Center & HMIS Update

BoS migration to NC HMIS is essentially complete

- All homeless dedicated service providers that are active on HMIS have
 - Submitted agency agreements
 - Completed provider page set ups
- Exceptions
 - Agencies that have projects crossing CoCs
 - Emergency Assistance Network (EAN) projects



AHAR was successfully submitted

- Bed coverage in all areas was between 65% and 100% except for Transitional Housing for Individuals (36%)
- Utilization rate was above 70% for all areas except Transitional Housing for Families (55%)
- Missing data rates were below 5% across the board
- THANKS to all agencies for your hard work cleaning data in December!



BoS HMIS bed coverage and utilization rates are good overall

AHAR Reporting Categories	Bed Coverage Rates	Average Util. Rates	Accepted by HUD
Emer. Shelter - Family	66%	73%	Yes
Emer. Shelter – Individual	65%	102%	Yes
Trans. Housing – Family	85%	55%	No
Trans. Housing – Individual	36%	85%	No
PSH – Family	100%	103%	Yes
PSH - Individual	100%	100%	Yes

Regional Lead/Regional Committee Information

Per BoS Governance Charter, Regional Committees elect leadership in January

- 1 Regional Lead
- 1 Regional Lead alternate
- Coordinated assessment lead(s)
- Elections are required, but leadership not required to change
 - Be sure to reflect elections and results in minutes
 - If Regional Lead is CoC or ESG grantee, consider electing alternate without these conflicts of interest
 - Back up for voting
 - In-person meeting for Regional Leads and alternates
 - Raleigh, Friday, March 4, 2016
 - Back up weather date: Monday, March 21, 2016
