# CoC Program Funding Update

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# HUD announced funding for Tier 2 for the FY2015 CoC competition.

- HUD announced funding for Tier 2 projects on May 2, 2016: <http://1.usa.gov/1Tqe4eR>
- Project list does not separate grants by CoC
- BoS CoC awarded \$1,249,382
  - Requested \$1,435,828
  - Two renewal projects not funded for a total of \$257,834



# Seven grants were funded in Tier 2.

- Projects that received funding:
  - 5 Cardinal Innovations PSH renewal grants
    - PSH Renewal Project that straddled Tier 1 and Tier 2
    - 4 other PSH Renewal Projects
  - 2 Housing Bonus new projects
    - Homeward Bound- PSH in Henderson County
    - Allied Churches- RRH in Alamance County
- Projects that did not receive funding:
  - 2 TH renewal projects
    - United Community Ministries
    - Sandhills Community Action Program
  - BoS staff have followed up with grantees to review appeals process
  - BoS staff have asked HUD for specifics about the funding decision



# CoC registration has opened for the FY 2016 CoC competition.

- HUD announced that CoC registration will be open from April 22, 2016 – May 11, 2016
- BoS staff will register the CoC for the competition



# Next steps in CoC competition

- Grant Inventory Worksheet
  - HUD will announce when GIW process begins
  - BoS staff will follow up with current CoC grantees
- New Project Intent to Apply
  - For agencies applying for new funding (not renewals)
  - Complete form: <http://bit.ly/23e1STr>
  - Housing Bonus funding available for:
    - PSH serving 100% chronically homeless individuals/families
    - RRH serving individuals/families coming from streets, shelter, or fleeing domestic violence



# 2016 Scorecard Committee will be formed by mid-June.

- Regional Committees each asked to appoint one rep for Scorecard Committee
- Responsibilities of Scorecard Committee
  - Determine criteria and scoring guidelines for new and renewal project scorecards
- Project Review Committee appointed after NOFA released (later in the year)

# Team Updates: Rapid Results

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# Two BoS teams participated in statewide event to end veteran homelessness

- Rapid Results Institute hosted a 2-day event in Raleigh
  - Sponsored by Department of Military and Veteran Affairs, Department of Health and Human Services and NCCEH
  - 6 teams from across North Carolina
  - 2 BoS teams:
    - Rowan County (Piedmont Regional Committee)
    - Onslow County
- Teams created 100 day goals, today is Day 71



# Update on Rowan Team Goals

## Placements

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Our goal is to house 10 veterans per month in Rowan, thereby housing 30 Veterans in 100 days and creating a system to sustain this rate.

## Team Structure

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Set up bi-weekly meeting for this team to update on goal progress & educate each other on programs and resources.

## Outreach

In 14 days, develop outreach committee with coordinated outreach events 2x per month.



# Update on Rowan Team Goals

## Leadership

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In 30 days bring Mayor & other council members into initiative and make asks for support and for a POC on their team to participate.

## Coordinated Entry

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In 45 days have Coordinated Assessment tool in place and in use by entry points.

## By Name List

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In 100 days have our by-name list in place with all providers at the table contributing to the list.

## Landlords

In 100 days hold 2 landlord events with 10 landlords each and get 10 landlords committed to prioritizing Veterans in their units.

- Lack of long-term funding after vouchers run out
- Prevention/Diversion

# Written Standards

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# Here's where we are with written standards

- The BoS CoC adopted preliminary written standards in October 2015
  - Necessary for the 2015 Emergency Solutions Grant application for grantees to be in compliance
  - Understood that these were preliminary and needed to be revised as soon as possible
  - Received initial feedback from ESG office about changes needed



# Strong written standards create strong programs!

- Give grantees specific guidelines for how to operate their programs to have the best chance of ending homelessness
- Creates consistency across the Balance of State
- Protects our clients, putting their needs first
- Provides a baseline for holding all of programs in the BoS to a specific standard of care



# HUD sets specific guidelines for a CoC's written standards

- Policies and procedures for evaluating individuals' and families' eligibility for and determining the process for prioritizing eligible households in:
  - Emergency Shelter
  - Transitional Housing
  - Rapid Re-Housing
  - Permanent Supportive Housing



# HUD sets specific guidelines for a CoC's written standards

- They should have policies and procedures for:
  - An Emergency Shelter's:
    - Admission, diversion, referral, and discharge standards as well as safeguards to meet needs for special populations such as victims of DV, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking
  - A Prevention and/or Rapid Rehousing program's:
    - Prioritization of eligible households
    - Standards determining the % or amount of financial assistance and housing stabilization services to households and for how long



# HUD sets specific guidelines for a CoC's written standards

- Policies and procedures for coordination among ES, TH, essential service providers, homelessness prevention, RRH, and PSH programs (coordinated assessment)
- Participation in the CoC's HMIS (with the exemption of DV or victims' services programs)



# We are beginning the process of revising our written standards

- Staff will send an email to all CoC and ESG grantees this week requesting feedback on the current written standards



# Point-in-Time Count

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# NCCEH submitted the BoS PIT and HIC to HUD on May 2

- CoCs submit PIT and HIC data to HUD through the Homeless Data Exchange (HDX) website
- HUD will verify data and then include it in the 2016 Annual Homeless Assessment Report (AHAR)
- NCCEH will post NC data at [www.ncceh.org/pitdata/](http://www.ncceh.org/pitdata/) in the coming weeks

The sheltered count decreased since 2015, while the unsheltered count increased.

Location	Count	Change Since 2015
Emergency Shelter	1682	- 145 (8%)
Transitional Housing	446	- 88 (16%)
Unsheltered	835	+ 175 (27%)
TOTAL	2963	- 58 (2%)



There were only slight changes in household compositions.

Household Type	Count	Change Since 2014
Adults & Children	1112	+ 13 (1%)
Adults Only	1836	- 61 (3%)
Children Only	15	- 10 (40%)
TOTAL	2963	- 58 (2%)



# Chronically homeless people & homeless veterans decreased.

Subpopulation	Count	Change Since 2014
Chronically Homeless (sheltered)	165	- 11 (6%)
Chronically Homeless (unsheltered)	183	- 1 (1%)
<b>Total Chronically Homeless</b>	<b>348</b>	<b>- 12 (3%)</b>
Veterans (sheltered)	82	- 17 (17%)
Veterans (unsheltered)	54	+ 16 (42%)
<b>Total Veterans</b>	<b>136</b>	<b>- 1 (1%)</b>
