Street Outreach Written Standards

Written standards provide benefits to the NC BoS CoC

- Gives grantees specific guidelines for how to best operate their programs to end homelessness
- Creates consistency across the NC BoS CoC
- Protects clients, putting their needs first
- Provides a baseline for holding all programs in the CoC to a specific standard of care



Background on NC BoS CoC's written standards

Timeline	Activity
October 2015	Preliminary written standards adopted
May 2016	NCCEH staff drafted updated written standards
June/July 2016	Written Standards workgroup vetted drafts and provided feedback to change drafts
August 2016	Open comment period for feedback to written standards from RCs and providers
September 2016	Final drafts posted and Steering Committee approval



Staff developed Street Outreach written standards

• Street outreach standards were not part of the original package approved because the CoC did not have these programs.

Today:

- SSVF providers are providing outreach to Vets
- ESG funded a NC BoS CoC provider for street outreach for the first time in 2018



Street outreach written standards lay out full scope of the program

- Standards: What must programs do to meet the standards of the NC BoS CoC?
 - *Personnel*: What kind of staff do programs need?
 - Outreach and Engagement: How do outreach programs engage people on the streets?
 - Case Management: What services are required and optional for street outreach?
 - *Termination:* When can programs terminate services?
 - *Client Files:* What are the minimum items to be in the client file?
 - Evaluation and Planning: What process must the program undergo to continually improve its services?

NCCEH's SSO-CE Grant

The basics of NCCEH's SSO-CE grant

- Awarded as part of the FY17 CoC competition
- Supports coordinated entry activities in NC BoS CoC
- Re-grant to between 3-8 agencies to implement coordinated entry in their regions (only 1 agency per region will be awarded)
- All dollars for implementation NOT planning



The SSO-CE grant will assist regions with CE implementation

Funding could help agencies serve as CE Lead by:

- Helping create by-name lists
- Facilitating case conferencing meetings
- Collecting and reporting regional outcomes
- Filling in gaps for assessing households needing help
- Outreaching agencies to join the system
- Training agencies and assessors

Funding is not intended to fund all aspects of CE work but to enhance what is already happening



Eligible applicants

- Be a current federal grantee
- Demonstrated understanding and experience with CE
- HMIS user with high quality data
- Regional CE system is currently functioning
- Region needs additional funding
- Support from the Regional Committee to become the CE Lead

CoC Competition Update

CoC competition should get underway soon

- NCCEH staff are preparing for this year's competition:
 - Funding and Performance Subcommittee is updating Funding Priorities
 - Staff conducted new CoC applicant webinar on March 8. The presentation recording is posted at: http://www.ncceh.org/bos/currentcocapplication/
 - PIT/HIC information will be due April 30 to HUD
 - System Performance Measures will be due May 31 to HUD
 - Released Intent to Apply information for new applicants



Intent to Apply form mandatory for all agencies applying for new CoC funds

- Intent to Apply form has been posted at:

 - Asks for preliminary info about proposed project
 - NCCEH staff review and follow-up with agency to discuss

- Rolling basis, non-binding
- Deadline: 1 week after NOFA release


2018 Project Review Committee Reps Needed

HMIS@NCCEH Launch: June 2018



What to expect:

- All training, workflows, forms, etc. will be hosted by NCCEH at ncceh.org.
- Users will no longer go to nchmis.org, the website run by MCAH, for forms or training.
- Users will have a new ServicePoint website URL to log in to.
- All agreements (agency participation, user, and sharing agreements) will need to be signed again with NCCEH as the HMIS Lead Agency. This will be done electronically with DocuSign.




What To Do Now

2018 PIT/HIC Update

Submission Date for ES and TH was February 21

- -All submissions have been reviewed
- -Data Center staff are working with HMIS users to make data corrections, and resubmit new reports

Submission Date for RRH and PSH was April 2

- All submissions are being reviewed
- Data Center staff will contact you if corrections are needed
- Most common issue: Missing Housing Move-in Dates at interim



We are still missing a lot of BoS Data!

This data is very important

- Informs local planning
- Used statewide to learn about NC homelessness
- Submitted to HUD and compiled with other CoCs to understand homelessness in the United States
