




## Henry Thoreau's Cabin

15' x 10' plus root cellar and attic 150 square feet

Beginning in late March of 1845, Henry David Thoreau built a tiny house on the shore of Walden Pond in Concord, Massachusetts, at a cost of \$28.12½. He spent two years in this cabin, built with his own hands, while proving his famous experiment—that man could live happily and independently of other men. In his book Walden, Thoreau left a complete description of his house (including a materials list, dimensions, building techniques, and cost) that has enabled the reconstruction of many exact replicas by Thoreau admirers.




















## **VARIETY OF SCALE**

Transitional exterior spaces enable one to navigate through varying spatial experiences, from the more secluded porch to the shared courtyard, before reaching the common green.



























































Community | 800 SF
