
North Carolina 2010 Point-in-Time Count

On the night of January 27, 2010, in North Carolina,

12,157 people experiencing homelessness were counted.

This includes:

- 9,513 households
- 8,292 single adults
- 1,304 families
- 2,249 children in families



*"Unsheltered" includes people staying in cars, in abandoned buildings, on sidewalks or the streets, or in other places not meant for human habitation.

12% (1479) of the people counted were chronically homeless.

11% (1364) of the people counted had a mental illness.

24% (2932) of the people counted had a diagnosable substance abuse disorder.

9% (1054) of the people counted were veterans.

12% (1411) of the people counted had been discharged from a healthcare or criminal justice system within the last 30 days.

5% (583) had been discharged from a jail or prison.

- 5% (596) had been discharged from a mental health hospital or substance abuse treatment program.
- 2% (232) had been discharged from a hospital.
