Minutes:

- Brian welcomed members. Members introduced themselves to new staff member, Jeremy Ratcliff.
- Andrea provided an overview of the meeting agenda.
- Andrea gave an update on the NC BoS CoC dashboard project.
 - Staff hope to have a draft dashboard to show at the June meeting but are confident that we will have something for sure by July.
- Andrea gave an overview of the 2021 Point-In-Time and Housing Inventory Count.
 - 2021 PIT/HIC data from January 27, 2021 was submitted to HUD by the May 14, 2021 deadline. Data did not include unsheltered count data due to safety issues because of the pandemic.
 - Limited data available by:
 - Household type
 - Subpopulations (Vets, Youth, CH)
 - Living Situation (ES, TH)
 - PIT (by region and county) posted at: ncceh.org/datacenter/pitdata
 - Andrea showed total PIT data trending since 2010 as a comparison of the number of people experiencing literal homelessness.






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
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*Unsheltered data was not collected in 2021 due to the pandemic.

• Andrea showed the way the CoC collected 2021 PIT data in comparison to 2020 PIT data.







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
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Andrea showed the total PIT count by region.

Andrea showed the number of Vets experiencing homelessness per region.






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
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Total Veterans Counted by Region 2021

• Andrea showed the number of people experiencing chronic homelessness per region.






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
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Total Experiencing Chronic Homelessness by Region 2021

Andrea showed the total beds per program type.







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Andrea showed bed coverage rates in HMIS per program type.

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- Melissa asked about the use of shared language to explain the differences in this year's count because of the pandemic.
 - Andrea explained that CoC stakeholders should mention that the unsheltered count was not conducted in 2021 due to safety concerns due to the pandemic. Shelter numbers were depressed in comparison to the prior year's count because of two main factors: the eviction moratorium, which limited the number of people who might have entered the system; and safety concerns for people needing temporary housing who were afraid of entering a congregate shelter setting.
- Staff mentioned that the CoC will need to keep in mind the limitations of this year's count as we use PIT data for the Racial Equity Assessment, CoC Funding Priorities, and the Annual Homeless Assessment Report.
- Andrea updated members on the process for the 2022 unsheltered PIT count.

NC BoS CoC Unsheltered Coordinated Entry Access

- Benefits of connecting people living unsheltered to the CE system:
 - Strengthens existing infrastructure
 - Connects people to emergency shelter
 - Connects people to services
 - Focuses on connection to permanent housing
- Defining roles:
 - CE Lead
 - Provider outreach: Engage with providers in the region to increase collaboration for outreach and access for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
 - Evaluate monthly progress (SSO-CE check-in calls) on connecting people living unsheltered to the BNL
 - Support data entry in HMIS and CE project
 - Support Unsheltered PIT lead





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- Unsheltered PIT Lead
 - Regional point person for providers around unsheltered access (updated in NC BoS CoC Governance Charter and approved by Steering Committee on May 4, 2021)
 - Coordinate with regional CE Leads
 - Ensure data collection happens on all people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
 - Engage all providers/organizations/stakeholders to understand the process
 - Provide additional training to providers/organizations/stakeholders
 - Regions should elect their Unsheltered PIT Lead by June 30, 2021
- NC BoS Regional CE Access: Andrea walked through data in each region, which the comparison
 of 2020 PIT count numbers to May 10, 2021 unsheltered households on the BNL. It was also
 noted this data includes information for households that called NC 2-1-1 and were entered into
 the HMIS Triage project.

- Training and resources
 - NCCEH currently planning for:
 - BNL report
 - Street outreach principles and tips
 - Data and tools
 - CEC meetings and supplemental trainings
 - Decision-making tool for regional roles
 - Update CE Access 101 for data collection





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- CEC members asked for training correspondence to include information about who should attend the training and suggested a place on NCCEH's website for street outreach trainings and resources.
- Data collection
 - Nicole walked through an Outreach Contact form for CE project entry. It is a paired down HMIS form. Suggestions included adding language to reflect Social Security Number as optional and adding a notes section for any additional information.
 - HMIS data entry options include an HMIS outreach project or the CE lead entering data into the CE project.
- NC BoS CoC CE unsheltered access next steps:
 - Regional next steps
 - Elect 2021-2022 Unsheltered PIT Lead by June 30, 2021
 - Gathering partners
 - Plan to ensure all counties are covered.
 - July agenda (Unsheltered PIT leads must be elected by June 30, 2021)
 - Overview of all tasks and timeline
 - Planning worksheet for regions to identify responsible party for each task
 - Ongoing outreach (clients and providers)
 - Follow-up services (assessment/etc.)

Emergency Housing Vouchers

- HUD released Notice PIH 2021-15 (HA) Emergency Housing Vouchers Operating Requirements
- HUD is allocating approximately 70,000 Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHVs) to Public Housing Agencies (PHAs). These EHVs are to assist individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness; at imminent risk of experiencing homelessness; fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking; or were recently homeless and for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having a high risk of housing instability.
- Continuums of Care (CoC) will have a critical role in this process:
 - Targeting: PHAs must work with community partners to determine the best use and targeting for EHVs along with other resources available in the community;
 - Referrals: EHVs will not be filled from PHA's current waiting list- all EHV's are referred from coordinated entry systems;
 - Eligibility: CoCs are responsible for determining whether the family qualifies under one of the four eligibility categories for EHVs.
- Reviewed the list of NC BoS CoC PHAs who were allocated vouchers and discussed local contacts and connections for outreach.
- Other important dates include:
 - May 10, 2021: EHV allocation announced (complete)





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
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- May 12, 2021: EHVs for CoCs webinar (complete)
- May 24, 2021: PHAs must inform HUD of the number of vouchers the PHA will accept
- July 1, 2021: Effective date for all EHVs
- July 31, 2021: PHA and CoC must enter a Memorandum of Understanding
- Technical Assistance dates from HUD (register here)
 - May 18, 2021, 3 PM Strategy for Targeting EHVs and Related Resources
 - May 20, 2021, 3 PM Making the Most of EHV Waivers
 - May 25, 2021, 3 PM Coordinated Entry and EHVs
 - June 1, 2021, 3 PM Pairing Services and EHVs

Prioritization

- Reviewed four categories of eligibility for CoCs and PHAs
 - Literal Homeless
 - An imminent risk of homeless
 - Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking
 - Recent Homeless and for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having high risk of housing instability







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The next CEC meeting is scheduled for July 19, 2021. With no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
