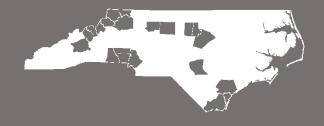


Racial Equity Subcommittee Meeting NC Balance of State CoC August 18th, 2021 at 9 AM

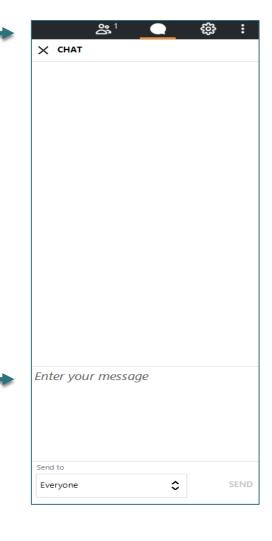

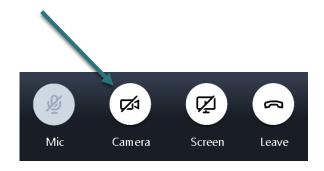


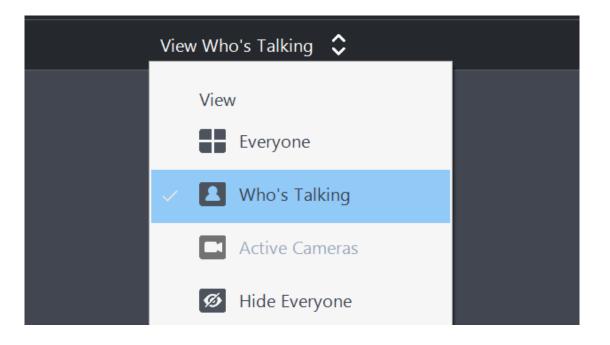


Camera

To foster connection, we encourage every member to **turn on** their camera. **The camera graphic** is at the bottom of your screen.

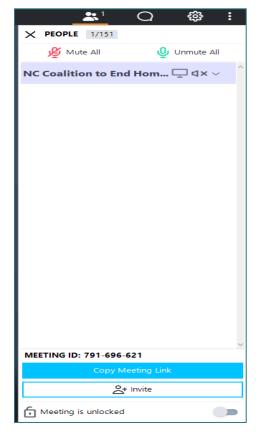
We have a lot of people! It may be easier to set the cameras to only show who is currently speaking. You can access this setting at the **top of the screen**.

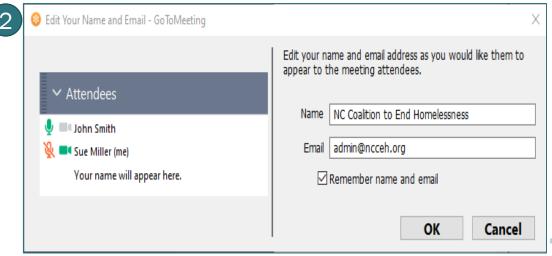


Report out from RE Dialogues Work Group meeting

2021 Racial Equity Assessment





HUD requires CoCs to conduct a RE Assessment annually to understand disparities.

Since the FY18 CoC competition, HUD has charged CoCs to assess racial disparities using Point-in-Time and HMIS data.

Assists CoCs to develop strategies to achieve racial equity

Through a collaboration of NCCEH staff and the RE subcommittee, we will present the 2021 RE Assessment

- Data Center and CoC staff pulled and evaluated data in four ways:
 - HUD Continuum of Care Assessment Tool
 - National Alliance to End Homelessness' Racial Equity Tool
 - HUD Stella Performance Module
 - NC BoS CoC coordinated entry data



The CoC expanded the scope of its analysis this year to better understand racial disparities.

HUD's CoC Assessment Tool

- Used in prior year's assessments
- Answers the question: Who does the CoC serve in comparison to people in NC and people in poverty?
- Uses 2020 PIT count data

NAEH Racial Equity Tool

- Used in prior year's assessments
- Answers the question: Who accesses permanent housing in the CoC's system?
- Uses Calendar Year 2020 HMIS data



The CoC expanded the scope of its analysis this year to better understand racial disparities.

HUD's Stella Performance Module

- New tool used for this year's assessment
- Answers the question: How does the system support people to end their homelessness?
- Uses Longitudinal System Analysis data 10/01/2019 09/30/2020 (HMIS)
- Focuses on how households flow through the system highlighting exits, returns, and length of time homeless
- Provides a deeper understanding of data from HUD and NAEH RE Tools
- Future: Visualizes intersection of race, ethnicity, and gender



The CoC expanded the scope of its analysis this year to better understand racial disparities.

NC BoS CoC coordinated entry data

- New data used for this year's assessment
- Answers the question: Who has access to CE and permanent housing resources?
- Uses CE by-name list (HMIS) and Back@Home data from 10/01/2020 06/30/2021
 Provides comparison between VI-SPDAT and Housing Barriers Assessments and how the CoC prioritizes households of different races and ethnicities


The RE Subcommittee needs to make a formal recommendation to the Steering Committee.
