Approval of Consent Agenda

- The consent agenda was voted on at the beginning of the meeting. Without changes or objection, the consent agenda was approved by common consent.

Letter of Support Request

Rowan Helping Ministries is seeking a letter of support for its grant request to The Department of Veterans Affairs' VA Grant Per Diem Program.

- The grant will allow the agency to continue partnering with the Salisbury VA Medical Center to provide transitional housing and supportive services to Veterans experiencing homelessness to return to permanent housing.
- Last year, the agency was awarded a \$450,000 grant from the VA GPD Capital Grant
 Program to support the construction of a third transitional housing facility on its campus. A

building has already been identified in Sanford, NC and will be renovated to meet the program's needs.

- o 10 GPD beds
 - 9 in a new transitional housing facility with private units
 - 1 in an existing transitional housing facility
- Veterans will be provided wrap-around supportive services including employment and educational opportunities, individual and group therapy, as well as community member support.
- Veterans are referred through the Salisbury VA Medical Center, which encompasses 21 counties: Alleghany, Anson, Ashe, Cabarrus, Davidson, Davie, Forsyth, Gaston, Guilford, Iredell, Mecklenburg, Montgomery, Randolph, Rowan, Surry, Stanly, Stokes, Stanly, Union, Yadkin, and Wilkes.

Alyce Knaflich asked which regions and CoCs the project could affect. Brian Alexander answered that Regions 7, 5, 4 plus the Northwest CoC, Winston-Salem/Forsyth CoC, Greenboro/High Point CoC, Gaston/Lincoln/Cleveland CoC, and Mecklenburg/Charlotte CoC.

Marie Watson motioned for approval of the Rowan Helping Ministries' letter of support request. James Stroud seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

The January Steering Committee meeting is the first meeting with new at-large members and new elected Regional Leads and Regional Lead Alternates. All present members, including Regional Lead Alternates, introduced themselves, providing a little background information along with the region or organization they represent.
