- 2. Introduction of Committee (those in attendance) and Regional updates

#### 3. Review and Approval of Minutes from February 2023

#### 4. Regional Leadership

- We still need someone to volunteer for the Unsheltered Access Coordinator position
- At this time, the CE Lead is still open. Caring Touch, United Way, & NC Commission of Indian Affairs are possibilities.
- Shaneitha Lee volunteered for the Project Review Committee Representative. Latasha McNair made a motion to accept the position and all voted to accept.

#### 5. COC Funding

- Webinars are available.
- Intent to apply must be submitted
- Scorecard committee would recommend new and returning projects
  - i. As the Project Review Committee representative, Ms. Shaneitha Lee will review and submit projects to be funded.

#### 6. NC HFA Funding

- Two different projects
  - i. Rental housing and noncongregate sheltering
  - ii. Low income housing is needed; if anyone knows of developers for housing, please share this information
  - iii. Organizations must be 5013c, present their most recent audit, and been in business for three years
  - iv. There will be two phases; all sites must be preapproved- 1<sup>st</sup> phase will consist of a site evaluation
  - v. Must be submitted by May 31, 2023
- This is the funding we have been waiting for, so please consider if it is within your capacity to do so.
- This is a forgivable loan

### 7. B@H Program COVID/CRF Funds

- Currently serving 9 individuals now
- 7 are currently in housing search
- Funding will end September 2023
- To date we have housed 107 families/individuals in this program

#### 8. Rapid Re-housing Program Update

- We are currently receiving referrals for RRH
- We currently have 7 active clients receiving financial assistance and supportive services
- All referrals verifying the client's homeless status should be sent to Hollie at SFVC until the CE Lead is determined for our Region.

### 9. PSH Update

- Robeson & Scotland Eastpointe do have open beds
- Trillium serves Columbus & Bladen no openings as of right now.
- Eastpointe completed a budget amendment and has a few more slots for housing still available. They are currently working with individuals on the waitlist to be housed.

## 10. HUD VASH/Veteran Services Update

#### 11. Coordinated Entry/Assessment

- In the process of finding a CE lead as stated before
- CE Lead partners would refer to the CE Lead; they would complete the P&D, and then a VISPDAT and then prioritize according to their need which program they need.
- SFVC has been acting as the call center
- Hopefully by our next meeting will have more information about who the new CE Lead will be.

  - i. RRH-for clients who are literally homeless, no prevention funds are available
  - ii. RRH-DV- For clients who are experiencing and attempting to flee DV
  - iii. RRH-CV Still have some funding left but will be used for those individuals who still qualify and originally applied for that specific program.
  - iv. PSH slots available as mentioned by Latasha. Clients must be literally homeless as well as well as chronically homeless
  - v. Veteran services Carla Clark-McRae with the Lumbee Tribe of NC (LTNC) is the contact person
    - 1. Please be advised LTNC veteran services are for all individuals and they also work with non-natives
