
North Carolina 2011 Point-in-Time Count

On the night of January 26, 2011, in North Carolina,

12,908 people experiencing homelessness were counted.

This includes:

- 9,377 households
- 8,223 single adults
- 1,460 families
- 2,895 children in families



^{*&}quot;Unsheltered" includes people staying in cars, in abandoned buildings, on sidewalks or the streets, or in other places not meant for human habitation.

13% (1695) of the people counted were chronically homeless.

15% (1983) of the people counted had a mental illness.

26% (3411) of the people counted had a diagnosable substance abuse disorder.

9% (1164) of the people counted were veterans.

13% (1655) of the people counted had been discharged from a healthcare or criminal justice system within the last 30 days.

5% (616) had been discharged from a jail or prison.

5% (690) had been discharged from a mental health hospital or substance abuse treatment program.

3% (349) had been discharged from a hospital.
