Current Work:

In order to transition an individual or family out of homelessness, they must have access to affordable housing, appropriate services and an adequate income. NCCEH works at the local, state and federal levels to insure these resources are available and accessible for North Carolinians who are most in need.

What we're doing in 2009 to end homelessness:

- Supporting local communities in planning and implementation of Ten-Year Plans to End Homelessness.
- Building provider capacity through training, education and technical assistance based on data and results-based best practices.
- Leading the NC SOAR (SSI/SSDI Outreach Access and Recovery) Initiative by providing training, technical assistance and planning assistance to communities engaged in accessing disability benefits for their homeless citizens who are unable to work due to mental and physical illness.
- Providing and analyzing research and data in partnership with the Carolina Homeless Information Network (CHIN).
- Advocating for policy change and adequate funding at the local, state and federal levels.
- Developing leaders, champions and advocates to bring about systems change to prevent homelessness and improve the current homeless services system for those who do become homeless.
