# **Definitions of Terms**

### **Homeless**

- Only people who are literally homeless according to HUD's definition should be counted in the Point-in-Time Count. This means that on the night of the count, they are living:
  - o In emergency shelter, including domestic violence shelters,
  - In transitional housing for homeless persons who originally came from the streets or emergency shelters, or
  - In places not meant for human habitation (cars, parks, sidewalks, abandoned buildings, the street).

## Sheltered/Unsheltered

- Sheltered homeless persons are residing in emergency shelter (including domestic violence shelters) or in transitional housing on the night of the count.
- Unsheltered homeless persons are residing in places not meant for human habitation on the night of the count, such as cars, parks, sidewalks, abandoned buildings, or on the street.

## **Permanent Supportive Housing**

People living in Permanent Supportive Housing are not considered homeless and should not be included in the TOTAL column (Column D). However, because the numbers of people and beds in Permanent Supportive Housing must be reported to HUD, this information is collected during the Point-in-Time Count.

#### **Chronically Homeless**

In 2011, the definition of chronically homeless was expanded to include both individuals and families.

- Definition: an unaccompanied homeless individual (18 or older) with a disabling condition OR a family with at least one adult member (18 or older) who has a disabling condition who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had a least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years.
  - The disabling condition can include mental illness, chronic substance abuse, HIV/AIDS, physical disability, or developmental disability.
