
North Carolina 2013 Point-in-Time Count

On the night of January 30, 2013, in North Carolina,

12,147 people experiencing homelessness were counted.

This includes:

- 8,909 households
- 7,463 single adults
- 1,517 families
- 2,911 children under 18



*"Unsheltered" includes people staying in cars, in abandoned buildings, on sidewalks or the streets, or in other places not meant for human habitation.

13% (1627) of the people counted were chronically homeless.

16% (1973) of the adults counted had a mental illness.

24% (2855) of the adults counted had a diagnosable substance abuse disorder.

9% (1138) of the adults counted were veterans.

10% (1221) of the adults counted had been discharged from a healthcare or criminal justice system within the last 30 days.

4% (497) had been discharged from a jail or prison.

4% (509) had been discharged from a mental health hospital or substance abuse treatment program.

2% (215) had been discharged from a hospital.
