#### **DEFINITIONS OF TERMS**

## **Imminently Literally Homeless**

• Someone who is at imminent risk of literal homelessness is currently housed and will lose his or her primary nighttime residence within 14 days,

AND

No subsequent residence has been identified,

AND

He or she lacks the resources or support networks needed to obtain other permanent housing.

## **At Risk of Homelessness**

- Someone who is at risk of homelessness has an income below 30% of Area Median Income (AMI), AND
- Lacks the resources or support networks needed to prevent them from entering emergency shelter or an unsheltered homeless situation,

AND

• Meets at least one of the following conditions: has moved 2 times in the last 60 days; is doubled up; will lose current housing within 21 days; lives in a hotel/motel (self-paid); lives in a severely overcrowded unit; is exiting a publicly-funded institution or system of care (hospital, mental health facility, foster care, jail/prison); or lives in housing associated with instability and increased risk of homelessness, as identified in the jurisdiction's Consolidated Plan.

#### Households

- Households with Adults and Children include households in which at least one adult and one child are present on the night of
  the count.
- **Households without Children** include single adults, adult couples without children, and adults with adult sons/daughters. It also includes adults who have children, but whose children are not present with them on the night of the count.
- Households of Only Children are households in which every person is under the age of 18. This includes unaccompanied
  children under 18, adolescent parents and their children, adolescent siblings, or other household configurations composed
  only of children.
