2017 CoC Competition

The CoC application is underway.

- HUD released the CoC NOFA on July 14
- The CoC consolidated application is due September 28
- CoC consolidated application has 3 parts
- 1. CoC application: CoC-wide info, completed by NCCEH staff with input from agencies, Steering Committee, other stakeholders
- 2. Project applications: individual applications from agencies for new and renewal projects
- 3. Project priority listing: ranked list of project applications, recommended by Project Review Committee and approved by Steering Committee

CoC application timeline

- August 18: Final due date for project application materials
- August 22: Project Review Committee holds first meeting
- August 24-31: Project Review Committee reviews & scores applications
- **September 5:** Steering Committee meeting
- **September 8:** Project Review Committee meets to create ranked list of projects
- **September 12:** Special Steering Committee meeting to approve ranked list of projects
- **September 13:** Project applicants notified if project included in final application
- **September 21:** Project applicants finish all revisions and hit submit in esnaps
- **September 22:** BoS posts full application to NCCEH website
- September 28: CoC application due to HUD

Project Review Committee meets September 8th to rank projects

- PRC members and staff finalized scoring of new and renewal applications last week
- PRC will meet on September 8th to rank projects to recommend for Steering Committee approval. PRC will use the following to rank projects:
 - Scores on scorecards
 - Standards and minimums
 - Funding priorities



PRC will use the 2017 Funding Priorities document for ranking

- Approved by the BoS Steering Committee in July 2017
 - Set overall priorities for BoS
 - Ensure essential infrastructure elements are in place, including HMIS and coordinated assessment
 - Ensure adequate coverage of PSH across the CoC
 - Increase the availability of RRH
 - Ensure CoC funding is being used well, including potentially reallocating some funding from projects that have patterns of low spending or poor performance

• Tuesday, September 12, 10:30-12:00

- Need to have quorum to take vote
 - If lead cannot attend, arrange for elected alternate to attend
 - Leads/alternates from applicant agencies must abstain from voting (but still count towards quorum)



ESG Update

Staff are preparing Regional Committees for the ESG process

- Staff have had orientation calls with each Regional Committee, except Region 1, to discuss this year's competition
 - Design of process
 - Questions to ask and answer
 - Focus on capacity of agencies chosen to:
 - Spend funding
 - Operate program component per Written Standards
 - Administer this federal program
 - HMIS
 - Coordinated assessment
 - Reimbursement-based



ESG application process will begin soon

- ESG application expected timeline:
 - Application release: Imminent likely this week
 - Deadline: October 23
 - Announcement and Contracts: mid-November/early December
 - Contracts Due: December 31
 - Project Start: January 1, 2018

- ESG regional and project applications have been revised
 - Staff will:

 - Provide CoC-wide answers for the regional application

Coordinated Assessment

• Read the draft changes: www.ncceh.org/files/8550/



- Page 1, Overview: deleted "emergency shelter"
- Page 4, Guiding Principles: Added accessibility paragraph.
- Page 6, Client Intake Process: Added bullet programs cannot screen out due to disability or substance use.
- Page 13, Assessment: ability to enter shelter if P&D screen is not available.



- Page 13, Assessment: Street outreach programs may choose to administer the VI-SPDAT on a different timeline to unsheltered households, as needed.
- Page 13, Assessment: In administering the VI-SPDAT, communities cannot require the disclosure of specific disabilities or diagnoses.
- Page 13, Assessment: Prioritization lists may not prioritize households based on a diagnosis or particular disability or another other protected status.



- Page 13, Assessment: Communities may track specific diagnosis or disability information, if it is necessary to determine eligibility
- Page 13, Assessment: Regional Committees may use additional prioritization factors as long as they are not discriminatory.



• Page 15, Assign with client choice: If a client rejects the program to which they are referred, they should maintain their place on the community-wide waitlist.



- New Section: Privacy Protections
 - Informed consent
 - Refusal to provide information
 - Disclosure of disabilities/diagnoses
- New Section: Safety Planning
 - Ensure safety of survivors of DV
 - Domestic violence protocol
 - Confidential tracking of survivors
 - Alternative CA systems



- New Section: Non-Discrimination and Equal Access
 - Survivors of DV may not be denied access.
 - CA must be available to all people, regardless of protected status.
 - CA must be available to all homeless subpopulations.
 - CA must ensure effective communication with people with disabilities.
 - CA must ensure effective communication with people with limited English proficiency.
 - Participants must be informed of the ability to file a nondiscrimination complaint.

HMIS Update

NC HMIS GC voted against initiating an RFP process

- NCCEH board & staff sent letter to NC HMIS
 Governance Committee requesting RFP to explore
 other options for HMIS administrator
 - The current administrator, MCAH, does not meet our needs:
 - Cannot pull accurate statewide data
 - Poor communication leading to data quality issues
 - Poor training leading to confused end users
 - Continued visibility issues for agencies that cross CoCs
- NC HMIS GC voted against an RFP at August 14th meeting



NCCEH and NC BoS CoC need to explore other options

- NCCEH is requesting HUDTA to explore options and set metrics to make decisions.
- NCCEH is hiring a consultant to help with visibility issues MCAH has not addressed.
- NCCEH Board will evaluate and make a decision at its November meeting
- BoS Steering Committee will need to approve a potential new direction for HMIS at its December meeting.
 - Staff will be reaching out to BoS for feedback prior to a vote to change our HMIS adminstrator



CoC Grant Transfer Request

In August, Steering Committee approved a policy requiring CoC approval for significant grant changes.

- Change of recipient (grant transfer) or subrecipient
- Change of project site (location)
- Addition/elimination of budget line items
- Shift of more that 10% from one budget line item to another
- Permanent change in subpopulation served
- Permanent reduction in number of units
- Closure of project or voluntary relinquishment of funding



Homeward Bound has requested to transfer its 2 PSH grants to Thrive.

- Homeward Bound currently has 2 PSH grants serving Henderson County
 - \$214,405, 22 units
- Thrive is mental health services provider interested in providing supportive housing
- Thrive has been operating as grant subrecipient since July
- Proposed transfer date is 11/1/17
