#### **DEFINITIONS OF TERMS**

### **Imminently Literally Homeless**

A person who is at imminent risk of literal homelessness is currently housed and will lose their primary nighttime residence within 14 days <u>AND</u> no subsequent residence has been identified, <u>AND</u> the person lacks the resources or support networks needed to obtain other permanent housing.

#### **At Risk of Homelessness**

A person who is at risk of homelessness has an income below 30% of Area Median Income (AMI) <u>AND</u> lacks the resources or support networks needed to prevent them from entering emergency shelter or an unsheltered homeless situation, <u>AND</u> meets at least one of the following conditions:

Has moved 2 times in the last 60 days; is doubled up; will lose current housing within 21 days; lives in a hotel/motel (self-paid); lives in a severely overcrowded unit; is exiting a publicly-funded institution or system of care (hospital, mental health facility, foster care, jail/prison); or lives in housing associated with instability and increased risk of homelessness, as identified in the jurisdiction's Consolidated Plan.

## **Households**

- 1. Households with Adults and Children: at least one adult and one child are present on the night of the count.
- **2.** Households without Children: single adults, adult couples without children, adults with adult sons/daughters, and adults whose children are not present with them on the night of the count.
- **3.** Households of Only Children: every person is aged 17 or younger. This includes unaccompanied children under 18, adolescent parents and their children, adolescent siblings, or other household configurations composed only of children.

#### **Survivors of Domestic Violence**

Adults who are currently experiencing homelessness because they are fleeing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.
