

2019 Point-in-Time Count

2019 PIT/HIC Goal!

The NC Balance of State CoC will complete accurate and comprehensive Point-In-Time and Housing Inventory Counts in 2019.

The PIT and HIC give us a picture of our homeless population & programs

Point-In-Time Count (PIT)

Count of people experiencing homelessness

Housing Inventory Count (HIC)

Count of the beds in the homelessness system

Temporary: Shelters and Transitional Housing

While here, people are counted as experiencing literal homelessness in the PIT

Permanent: Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing While here, people are not counted as experiencing homelessness

PIT and HIC counted at the same time

Night of Wednesday, January 30, 2019

Snapshot of our system at a single point in time

Who is included in the PIT & HIC?

PIT: Literal Homelessness	HIC: Dedicated Homelessness Programs
Emergency Shelter (includes DV and seasonal)	Emergency Shelter (includes DV and seasonal)
Transitional Housing	Transitional Housing
Unsheltered Homelessness	Rapid Re-Housing Permanent Supportive Housing
If they're not in one of those 3 locations on the night of January 30, do not count them in the PIT!	Dedicated homelessness programs meet 3 criteria: 1) Primary intent is to serve people experiencing homelessness 2) Homelessness status is eligibility requirement 3) Actual program participants are experiencing homelessness

Many counties did not have an unsheltered count in 2018

18 counties did not conduct an unsheltered count

Anson, Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Davidson, Edgecombe, Franklin, Granville, Halifax, Hoke, Hyde, Madison, Northampton, Pamlico Perquimans, Tyrrell, Vance, Warren

8 counties counted '0' in their unsheltered count

13 counties counted 1-5 unsheltered people

PIT/HIC data is an important tool and resource for your communities

Inclusive count of homeless populations

Includes non-HMIS agencies

Includes unsheltered homeless populations

Can use local and regional data to:

Understand size/scope of homeless populations

Assess system for gaps (do your programs match your populations needs?)

Track increases/decreases

Locate and engage unsheltered homeless populations

Raise community and political awareness of homelessness



Regional Committees need to keep these objectives in mind as they plan the 2019 count.

- Identify needed tasks, identify people to complete them, and plan timeline
- Facilitate communication about PIT/HIC throughout the region
- Ensure coverage across entire region
- Ensure data collected is complete and accurate

Regional Committee Elections

Regional Committee Elections

- Regional Committees should hold elections for 2019 leadership positions in the fourth quarter of 2018. The elected leadership positions are:
 - Regional Lead
 - Regional Lead Alternate
 - Point-in-Time Count Lead*
 - Coordinated Entry Lead
 - ESG Funding Process Lead
 - CoC Project Review Committee Lead
 - Secretary/Webmaster
 - Others at the Regional Committee's discretion (county leads, Veteran leads, etc.)

^{*}Selections were due 10/31/2018

Regional Committee Elections

- People who are currently serving in a leadership position may be re-elected. However, Regional Committees are encouraged to provide mentoring and guidance that will help bring in new leadership as well.
- No agency may serve in more than 2 lead positions per region.

Governance Charter Updates

The NC BoS CoC Governance Charter has been updated to reflect changes in 2018

- The charter was last updated in June 2018 to reflect changes regarding HMIS transition
 - Annual update is required by HUD

 - Regional leadership positions
 - Subcommittee additions
 - Updated written standards

Updated terminology

 Updated the Governance Charter to include the new Longitudinal System Analysis (LSA) report that will be submitted to HUD, replacing the former AHAR process

• Changed Coordinated Assessment to Coordinated Entry throughout the Governance Charter to match HUD's use of the term.


