VAWA Emergency Transfer Plan updates

HUD released a VAWA Lease Addendum that can be added to a landlord's standard lease. Housing providers that operate tenant-based rental assistance must enter into a contract with the owner or landlord of the housing that requires the owner or landlord of the housing to comply with all provisions of VAWA regulations under 24 CFR part 5, subpart L. The VAWA Emergency transfer Plan now includes this resource in Section 10 and it also included in Appendix IV.

Minutes:

The Coordinated Entry Council discussed the APR data HUD requires from CoCs that receive SSO-CE funding.

- Because the NC BoS CoC receives SSO-CE funding, HUD requires we report APR data to them on the whole CoC's CE system.
- Ehren described the data HUD is asking for on the SSO-CE APR and asked for questions or feedback.
- The questions below are the questions we need to report for the SSO-CE APR:

Assessments

How many households were assessed using the VI-SPDAT and added to the coordinated entry by-name list?

How many of these households were adults only (no children)?

How many of these households were adults and children?

How many of these households were children only (under 18)?

Referrals

How many households were referred from the coordinated entry byname list to transitional housing and enrolled in that project?

How many households were referred from the coordinated entry byname list to rapid re-housing and enrolled in that project?

How many households were referred from the coordinated entry byname list to permanent supportive housing and enrolled in that project?





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How many households were referred to and enrolled in another housing project that is not dedicated to serve people experiencing homelessness (like Public Housing Authorities)?

How many households were on the by-name list during this period who could not be referred to a housing program because a program was not available for them?

How many households were not enrolled in a program because they declined the referral(s) they were given?

How many households found housing without the help of the CE system?

How many households were referred and enrolled in another housing program not specified above?

Total referrals

How many households were removed from the by-name list because the CE system lost contact with them, they died, or they were institutionalized for a long period of time?

By-Name List Totals

How many total households were on the by-name list at the beginning of the reporting period?

Timelines

For households that have NOT been enrolled in a program: What is the average length of time households have been on the by-name list without an enrollment?

For households that HAVE been enrolled in a program via a coordinated entry referral: What is the average length of time between the date households were added to the by-name list and they were enrolled in a housing program?

For those who have been housed through a direct coordinated entry referral, what is the average length of time between the date they were added to the by-name list and the date they were housed? (If known)

- This data will replace the current CE outcomes data.
- The CEC agreed they will try to get this data together by April's meeting.

The CEC also discussed what about CE they want to work to improve this year. Some ideas were:

- Feedback loop from permanent housing. Or feedback loops and communication generally.
- Training for new staff/clear procedures per region.
- DV referrals into CE.
