I. Balance of State Update – Brian Alexander, NCCEH

- -NCCEH- statewide agency responsible for creating a robust system of care for the CoC- 13 regional committees that make up 79 counties.
- -PRC is the largest in terms of number of people served, the largest with the most resources

III. Coordinated Assessment (Coordinated Entry) Update – Teresa Robinson/Ehren Dohler

- Meet and Greet recap, groups came together to talk about challenges in community, transient clients, what does "good" look like in serving your community.
- HMIS data, provides platform to communicate data back out to individual agency- including how many people were served in what capacity.

Ehren (Coordinated Assesment -Coordinated Entry, ,used interchangeably) CE (coordinated entry)

- -Core of CE is used for a community to prioritize the limited resources available on hand for those individuals that need them the most.
- CE will and can drive funding decisions. CE tells us how many need the resources.
- -Robust HMIS data is entering the VI-SPDAT (objective assessment) into HMIS
- PRC is 1 of 5 pilot regions to look at funding for CE
- COC/ESG funding participation in CE is based on engagement/ex: applications
