Annual Coordinated Entry Evaluation



The CoC evaluates the CE system to understand how we are doing and mark areas for improvement.

Current CE evaluation framework:

- Surveys provided to:
 - People currently experiencing homelessness, after VI-SPDAT
 - People in RRH and PSH programs
 - CE participating providers
- RRH surveys distributed on rolling basis
- VI-SPDAT surveys during two-week period (set by Coordinated Entry Council)
- PSH surveys during two-month period, end the same week as VI-SPDAT surveys (set by CEC)



RRH surveys should be distributed now

- To all currently enrolled RRH clients
- To all future RRH clients, on a rolling basis
- All materials available at <u>www.ncceh.org/coordinatedentry</u>



CEC decided to end survey collection April 4.

- Surveys should be distributed with every VI-SPDAT for 2 weeks starting Sunday, March 22.
- Surveys will be distributed to PSH clients (only those enrolled in the last year) for 2 months prior, starting February 4



- We plan to provide a regional breakdown (per ESG office request) in the analysis this year.
- Having few respondents from a region could mis-represent the CE process in that region.




Supportive Services for Veteran Families Program (SSVF)

 - Take all referrals through the Coordinated Entry System




2020 Point-in-Time/Housing Inventory Count

PIT/HIC data is an important tool and resource for your communities

Inclusive count of homeless populations

Includes non-HMIS agencies

Includes unsheltered homeless populations

Can use local and regional data to:

Understand size/scope of homeless populations

Assess system for gaps (do your programs match your populations needs?)

Track increases/decreases

Locate and engage unsheltered homeless populations

Raise community and political awareness of homelessness



Key Terms

Point-In-Time Count (PIT)

Count of people experiencing homelessness on one night

Housing Inventory Chart (HIC)

Count of the beds in the homelessness system

Temporary: Shelters and Transitional Housing

While here, people are counted as experiencing literal homelessness in the PIT

Permanent: Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing

• While here, people are not counted as experiencing homelessness – but we still use the surveys to inform our reports!



Funding and Performance Subcommittee Update



FPS has a specific role to play for the NC BoS CoC.

From the NC BoS CoC Governance Charter, the FPS will:

- Assist the Steering Committee to set goals and priorities for the CoC and to make funding decisions.
- Analyze relevant data including, but not limited to, system performance measures, progress toward ending homelessness among subpopulations, and resource allocation.



FPS will be working to fulfill its role to look at and share data regularly.

- Work with HMIS@NCCEH to pull data from HMIS.
- As a subcommittee, assess available information and develop a shared knowledge about what is happening in the CoC.
- Work with NC BoS CoC staff to create a dashboard to share monthly with the Steering Committee.
- Discuss what steps might be taken to have a greater impact and bring this wisdom to the Steering and Regional Committees.



Bringing together pieces of the puzzle

Looking at data regularly gives us insight into our system:

- What is the scope of our work?
- What are some of the major activities?
- What is happening over time?
- Is there any impact if we change how we do things?
- Are there ways to improve our data?



FPS will develop a dashboard that the Steering Committee will review at each meeting!


Dashboards as a tool can:

- Demystify data
- Replace complexity with insight
- Draw attention to important data
- Increase interactivity and exploration
- Develop strategies for impact
