- Balance of State Steering Committee Update
  - Top priorities for initial response to COVID-19 in homelessness system:
    - Safety and Health Supplies for Emergency Shelter and Unsheltered
      - CDC guidelines for homeless shelters to keep people healthy. Support the health of people living in unsheltered settings.
    - Medical Shelter
      - Provide quarantine and isolation options for people who are symptomatic or who test positive for COVIF-19. Provide recovery or care options for patients experiencing homelessness to receive care for other health issues to preserve hospital beds.
    - Housing Stabilization
      - Move people out of homelessness and into housing so they can follow social distancing and hygiene guidelines to reduce the spread.
      - Keep people at-risk of homelessness in their housing with the ability to stay-at-home.
      - Funding & Performance Subcommittee Priorities
        - Ensure essential infrastructure is in place (HMIS & CE)
        - Ensure adequate coverage of PSH
        - Increase availability for RRH
        - Ensure CoC funding is being used well, including potentially reallocating some funding from projects that have patterns of poor spending or poor performance.
        - Increasing RRH tier 2 priority; Increasing PSH tier 3
  - Domestic Violence Rapid Rehousing project denied
- Coordinated Assessment Update
  - Coordinated Entry Evaluation postponed
  - HERE now has a Coordinated Entry Project in HMIS and will begin moving towards conducting CE through HMIS.
- Rapid Rehousing Update
  - \$36,934.85 spent out of \$61,500 for the year. Increased allotments are expected to be received to provide response to COVID-19.

- Waivers ESG has requested a waiver from HUD to not apply the FMR cap for new leases signed for the next six months (or until October). To place a client in a unit above FMR, you must first submit a completed Rent Reasonableness certification to HERE for approval.
