- 384 people have called into 211 for our counties
- 211 Back @ Home currently paused
- Currently housed 38 families, we are currently working with
- 17 families are stably placed
- 74 people in housing search
- 200 plus people to complete assessments on
- Anna Register new employee with be assisting on intakes
- Looking for a case manager for Scotland County area
- Encouraging assistance with finding additional landlords due to shortage of housing

## 8. Rapid Rehousing Program

- Currently housed 23 families for the year
- Two individuals have lost housing
- 8 families are waiting to be housed
- Encouraging others to refer landlords to the program
