Approval of Consent Agenda

- The consent agenda was voted on at the beginning of the meeting. Without changes or objection, the consent agenda was approved by common consent.

Letter of Support Request

Western Piedmont Council of Governments (WPCOG) is applying to become a Moving to Work Expansion Agency – Asset Building Cohort

- The goals of the program are to increase housing choice, increase self-sufficiency, and increase cost effectiveness.
- Randomly selects at least 25 participants receiving Housing Choice Vouchers and deposits funds into a bank account monthly for 24 months.

• The program will prevent evictions, ensure families are 'banked' and strengthen housing stability through asset building.

Tonya Freeman asked if the Moving to Work Expansion limits rental assistance to 5 years in a lifetime, such as the Moving to Work model for some PHAs. Allie Card asked WPCOG, which answered that no, there is no limit.

Tonya motioned for approval, and James Stroud seconded the motion. The motion to provide a letter of support to WPCOG was unanimously approved.

FY2022 CoC Competitions Update

The initial phases of the FY2022 CoC competition have begun:

- Registration is now complete for the CoC as of 5/6
- Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW) submitted to the HUD Field Office on 07/06
- Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) August release? Due before 10/20

NCCEH staff have begun to slowly prepare for this year's competition:

- Intent to Apply process ready:
 - The Intent to Apply form is mandatory for all agencies applying for new FY22
 CoC funds and can be submitted at:

- Any agency wanting to apply for a new CoC project in the FY22 competition is required to submit a form.
- Asks for preliminary information about proposed project(s)
- NCCEH staff will review and follow-up with the agency to discuss
 - Staff will schedule follow-up calls later in the year once we have more details.
- Rolling-basis, non-binding
- Deadline: 2 weeks after NOFO release
- Eligible activities: Rapid Rehousing and Permanent Supportive Housing

HUD released a Special NOFO to address unsheltered and rural homelessness on June 22nd.

- Unsheltered set-aside: \$14,843,764 –Full geographic coverage
- Rural set-aside: \$10,478,984 –55 designated rural counties
- Grant terms: 3 years
- CoC funding that follows the CoC Interim Rule and can be renewed

Final application due October 20th

Both set-asides require the CoC to produce a Plan for Serving HHs Experiencing Homelessness with Severe Service Needs. The plan consists of several sections:

- Leveraging Housing Resources
 - Development of new units outside of CoC and ESG resources signed agreements required
- Leveraging Healthcare Resources
 - Development of agreements with healthcare providers to support HHs in RRH and PSH developed through this funding
- CoCs current strategy to identify, shelter, and house HHs experiencing unsheltered homelessness
 - Current street outreach strategy
 - Current strategy to provide immediate low-barrier shelter for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
 - Current strategy to provide low-barrier permanent housing for people experiencing unsheltered homelessness
- Updating the CoCs strategy to identify, shelter, and house HHs experiencing unsheltered homelessness with data and performance
- Identify and prioritize HHs experiencing or with histories of unsheltered homelessness
- Involving people with lived expertise in decision-making
- Supporting underserved communities and supporting equitable community development

The plan requires approval by the CoC, and all applicants must show adherence to principles in the plan.

- The Lived Expertise Advisory Council will vet the plan on July 22nd.
- The Funding and Performance Subcommittee will vet and provide recommendation of plan on July 28th.
- The Steering Committee will formerly approve the plan on August 2nd.
- The CE Council will recommend updated assessment and prioritization schedule.

The CoC process will be similar to our annual CoC NOFO process with some potential tweaks. The CoC will review and rank projects using the Project Review Committee and the final recommended lists will be approved by the Steering Committee.

- CoC-wide application (for both set-asides)
- Priority project listing: unsheltered set-aside
- Priority project listing: rural set-aside

There is potential for streamlining the process, including:

- Open call for applications
- Prioritization of CoC-wide projects
- Prioritize building infrastructure

Focus staff time on things that will make the application competitive

Lived Expertise Advisory Council (LEAC) Update

The purpose of the NC BoS CoC Lived Expertise Advisory Council (LEAC) is to improve the provision of services to people experiencing homelessness, and the policies that govern these services, across the NC Balance of State CoC, through insights and expertise that come from people experiencing homelessness firsthand.

Rachelle Dugan provided an update on behalf of the LEAC. Updates included:

- Participation in governance beyond tokenism
 - The group has invested time throughout 2022 to build knowledge and relationship among members so that everyone feels that they can participate.
 - The LEAC presented at the 2022 Bringing It Home Conference and a strategic planning meeting of the NCCEH Board of Directors.
 - Through recruitment efforts, LEAC members are now present on all committees of the CoC except for the Scorecard Subcommittee.
 - Recruitment is ongoing to fill 3 more seats on the LEAC. Seeking membership from people who have recently experienced homelessness living in the eastern part of the state. Email laurel.mcnamee@ncceh.org
 for more info and to refer a candidate.
- The LEAC is impacting service provision.
 - The LEAC has committed to creating a Client Bill of Rights for the NC Balance of State CoC.
 - This document will guide service provision across the NC BoS CoC and establish a baseline for honest, respectful, and transparent services.
 - Currently in its research and drafting phase. Goal of Steering Committee approval in Fall 2022.

CY23 ESG Competition Update

The NC ESG office met with CoC staff ahead of releasing the ESG RFA for CY23 funding and notified us of details on timing and funding.

- RFA anticipated release on July 19th
- This information allows us to work further ahead and give applicants as much time as possible to create and submit competitive applications.
- NCCEH staff have also hosted a webinar for Regional Committee members on June 29th and will host a webinar for Project Applicants on July 20th.

- The project application instructions are being finalized and will be released ahead of the RFA
- This will allow applicants to plan for a timely submission and begin collecting the needed supplemental materials.
- The Project Application form, budget form, and supplemental ESG forms will not be available until July 19th.
- Between 7/12 and 7/19, agencies can begin completing their packet by:
 - Becoming familiar with the process and timeline
 - o Planning for the time needed to submit the application by 8/12 deadline
 - Completing the NC BoS CoC Supplemental Information Form
 - Cleaning HMIS data and practice running an APR
 - Locating agency policies and procedures (including client rules)

- Racial Equity Section
- Performance section
- Community involvement section
- Full adherence to written standards is expected
- Full participation in coordinated entry is expected

In accordance with the conflict-of-interest policy, persons attending Steering Committee or Regional Committee meeting representing an agency applying for CY23 ESG Annual Allocation Funding may not:

- Participate in conversation about applicants
- Facilitate Regional Committee meetings to recommend agencies for funding
- Ask questions about the funding proposal for your agency
- Make a motion related to approving or recommending an agency for funding
- Vote on the Regional Prioritization Form or proposed slate of applicants (Steering Committee meeting only)

The role of Regional Committees should be to:

- Spread the word and start now:
 - Many of the providers in your regions may not hear critical information about application deadlines and material if it does not come from you.
 - Encourage any interested providers to email <u>bos@ncceh.org</u> and request to be added to our general email list if they are not already.
 - Forward all ESG competition information to your networks, especially the application instructions.
- Be prepared to answer questions correctly:
 - Applicants may come to you before asking NCCEH staff.




The 2022 Racial Equity Assessment is underway.


- The Data Center and NC BoS CoC staff are collaborating with the Racial Equity Subcommittee to draft this annual assessment.
- Draft for Steering Committee Approval anticipated in Fall 2022.


2022 NC BoS CoC Housing Inventory Count
