- Project CATCH introduction
  - Increase access to childcare and resources to children experiencing homelessness
  - Review homelessness definition and provided some stats pertaining to early child homelessness in NC
    - 1 in 26 children under age 6 experience homelessness in NC
    - 92% unserved
    - Impacts from homelessness reviewed
    - Provided learning and data resources for this population
- Coordinated Entry Update (Denise Bean)
  - If client is homeless 14 days or longer, refer to HERE in Jackson (CE Lead) to put on By-Name list with VI-SPDAT (all agencies except DV)
  - If DV, share with HERE in Jackson initials and VI-SDAT score to put on list manually
  - Derek sent out follow up email 10/13 with Coordinated Entry packet provided by Denise at HERE with reminder that referring party would also need to send VI-SPDAT

to HERE; DV agencies don't need to send in the packet.

- Recent email from NCCEH on 10/4, that on Friday 10/14, no longer able to accept EHV referrals for NC Commission of Indian Affairs
- Veronica Murphy, REACH of Macon had question about if could get formal training on VI-SPDAT

- Rapid Rehousing Update (Denise Bean)
  - Annual 2022 Housed 10 households
    - 8 clients Jackson
    - 2-3 looking for housing Macon
    - 1working with in Swain
    - Allocated \$55,000 for 2022; Balance \$31,207.47, expires 12/31/22
- Back@Home Update (Denise Bean)
  - Ended 9/30/22
  - Since beginning, served 77 households with housing and 9 households with prevention to homelessness over 8 counties
  - Dan Ferreira, Four Square Community Action had a question with Back@Home for a person who has eviction papers, tomorrow, if housed no longer on by name list, will follow up with HERE in Jackson
- Permanent Supportive Housing Update (Derek Lancour)
  - 40 total households served
    - Awaiting 1 more item for new PSH household's referral
    - 71 total persons
      - 56 adults
      - 15 children
    - 36 households are currently in housing
    - 4 households are looking for housing
      - Looking in; Haywood, Graham, Clay, and Jackson
    - 2 rehouses since last month's meeting
  - Spending through 4 months is behind and the current trajectory will not meet 90% minimum spending goal
- Agency Report Outs
  - Four Square Community Action Daniel Ferreira Broadening scope of activities with hiring social workers; noted rents high, Fair Market Rents (FMR's) even with comparable's on proposed rent in this marketplace; landlords asking for too high rents

- Restoration House Parker Chatham, Rick Matheni Shelter opens 11/15; 11/1 begin taking referrals
- Community Resources of Macon Rhonda Blanton Drive Thru Flu Clinic today 10/13; COVID Booster Drive Thru soon; Seeing Seniors losing their housing with rent increases
- REACH of Macon Veronica Murphy Rentals available but rent is outrageous; Shelter repairs from flooding, currently at half capacity because of repairs; some movement to accept additional persons as others move out
- Other Discussion regarding tight rental market with high rents: Cullowhee Apts single bedroom apts rented by room many to students, shared housing /creative solutions; some houses substandard can't pass inspection; \$2000/month place in Andrews with no heat; seeing \$1200 + per month; \$2000/month for a camper

  - Recruiting in 4<sup>th</sup> quarter for filling leadership roles in 2023 for each region
  - Particularly needed is Unsheltered Access Coordinator who is integral in Point in Time (PIT) at the beginning of 2023 as well as preparing for PIT and reporting after.
