Definitions of Terms

Unsheltered

An unsheltered homeless person is someone who, on the night of the Point-in-Time Count, was residing in a place not meant for human habitation. These places include cars, parks, abandoned buildings, encampments, sidewalks, or the streets.

Households

- Households with Dependent Children include households in which at least one adult and one
 child are present on the night of the count.
- Households without Dependent Children include single adults and adult couples without
 children. It also includes adults who have children, but whose children are not present with them
 on the night of the count.
- **Households of Only Children** are households in which every person is under the age of 18. This includes unaccompanied children under 18, adolescent parents and their children, adolescent siblings, or other household configurations composed only of children.

Chronically Homeless

In 2011, the definition of chronically homeless was expanded to include both individuals and families.

- Definition: an unaccompanied homeless individual (18 or older) with a disabling condition OR a
 family with at least one adult member (18 or older) who has a disabling condition who has either
 been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had a least four episodes of
 homelessness in the past three years.
 - The disabling condition can include mental illness, chronic substance abuse, HIV/AIDS, physical disability, or developmental disability.
