Brief History of Homelessness Response

- 1980's (First Response Emergency Shelters)
- 1990's (Continuum of Care Created based on Housing Readiness Model)
- 2000's (New Permanent Supportive Housing emphasis, Move from managing homelessness to ending homelessness, Congress mandates HMIS, Local Ten-Year Plans to End Homelessness)
- 2010's (Use of evidence-based practices, new RRH & Prevention emphasis in addition to PSH, Federal Strategic Plan to Prevent & End Homelessness)

HEARTH



- President Obama signed HEARTH Act May 20, 2009
- First significant change to McKinney-Vento in 20 years
- Required federal strategic plan to end homelessness



HEARTH Purpose

"...to establish a Federal goal of ensuring that individuals and families who become homeless return to permanent housing within 30 days."

HEARTH Act Purposes - Sec. 1002(b)

Opening Doors: Federal Strategic Plan to End Homelessness

FOUR GOALS:

- □ Finish the job of ending chronic homelessness in 5 years
- □ Prevent and end homelessness among Veterans in 5 years
- Prevent and end homelessness for families, youth and children in 10 years
- Set a path to ending all types of homelessness

- □ Performance evaluation across entire CoC/Region
- □ What will be measured:
 - New homelessness
 - Length of homelessness
 - Repeat homelessness

Continuum of Care

- A Continuum of Care (CoC) is a regional or local planning body that coordinates housing and services funding for homeless families and individuals
- Wide range of agencies and organizations represented
- Promotes Communitywide commitment to ending homelessness
- Required group for applying for HUD Homeless funding



Regional Committee Responsibilities

- Appointees
 - Regional Lead
 - Official elected alternate
 - Representative to CoC Scorecard Committee
 - Representative to CoC Project Review Committee
 - Cannot also represent an agency applying for funding
 - Representatives to working groups as necessary

- Provide info to NCCEH
 - □ Point-in-Time count and bed inventory
 - Listing of member agencies and services provided
- Broad-based community stakeholder participation
- □ Promote data quality
 - Quarterly Performance Reports (QPRs) to NC BoS
 - Annual Performance Reports (APR) to HUD
 - High-quality data within CHIN HMIS

Regional Committee Responsibilities

- □ Coordinate ESG for region
- □ Encourage participation in NC BoS Subcommittees
- Coordinate local temporary and permanent housing, services, and other resources
- □ Ensure adequate HMIS bed coverage
- Support priorities set by NC BoS Steering
 Committee






Application Process: CoC




Application Process: NC BoS CoC
