1115 Waiver

- In September 2015, the General Assembly enacted Session Law 2015-245
- On November 20, 2017 NC submitted an amended 1115 demonstration waiver application to CMS
 - Main focus is on managed care transformation
- Key components of the waiver include
 - Opioid Strategy
 - Behavioral Health Integration
 - Tailored Plans
 - Public-Private Regional Pilots
 - Workforce
 - Telemedicine
 - Payments to Safety-Net Providers

What Does This Mean?

- NCDHHS is awaiting approval determination from CMS
- Discussion and feedback from stakeholders continues to occur
- This is a multi-year effort

Everyone Deserves a Home

- Plans are being developed to open referral sources for BH services
- A request has been made to increase funding for PATH programs
- Community based collaboration with LME/MCOs and housing providers occur every day
- Olmstead settlement work continues with the Transition to Community Living Initiative





Community Support Team Definition

 Expansion of services available to assist people in being successful in obtaining and maintaining housing

Currently in the State Plan Amendment process,

out for public comment soon

Must receive CMS approval

Partnership with NCHFA

- Ongoing work developing the Transitions to Community Living Voucher program
 - Scattered site subsidies administered by LME/MCOs
- Continued collaboration with NC Housing Finance Agency and LIHTC deals
 - Targeting and Key
 - Required 10% set aside in all development
 - Ability to expand to 20%

Integrated Supportive Housing Program

- Development of Integrated Supportive Housing Program with NCHFA
 - Rolled out the first application process, through collaborations with LME/MCOs
 - 8 deals have been conditionally approved
 - Total of \$10.8 million allocated
 - 98 set aside units

DHHS Strategic Housing Plan

- Working with TAC to execute
 - Hoping to be complete by the end of 2018
- We will address all populations served by DHHS
- Stakeholder input
