Guest Speakers:

Michelle Marcano, Division Director of the Union County Veterans Service Office

Michelle provided an overview of the resources offered at Union County Veterans Services. The following resources were identified.

- Union County Veterans Services is not a government employer; it's not part of the VA. This is a local service provider and is operated by the local government.
- No fees charged to veterans. (Home visits are also available)
- The office is located in the Historic Post Office in Monroe.
- Michelle provided the Mission Statement: Here to Help Veterans. To offer fund resources or agency assistance to access Federal, State and County benefits.
- Transportation to and from clinics is provided by County tax dollars
- VSO provides ID cards to veterans.



- The Monroe office has 4 employees. The VA sends out a census of individuals who receive services from the VA (Approximately 13,000 veterans are served in Union County). The size of the office staff is based upon the number of veterans served.
- Michelle reviewed benefits and services offered via the Monroe office. Michelle mentioned that the VA offices are not do not have an integrated computer system. This means that veterans need to update information at each local office utilized. The VSO can offer assistance with getting changed at each office.
- Michelle mentioned resource available to veteran's spouses called Death Indemnity Compensation (DIC). Spouse would receive benefits based upon the medical condition of the veteran.
- There is a new VA facility in Charlotte called VA Charlotte Tyvola.
- The Annual Veterans Day Ceremony is scheduled for November 10, 2018.

- The Veterans Bridge Home (VBH) provides services to service members, active duty service family members and immediate family members (including dependent children). The VBH will assist families with transition(s).
- Walmart provided significant funding to establish NCServes.
 Union County is located in the Metrolina area. NCServes supports the local VSO. Walmart was interested in improving assistance to military families.



- The USO and Western region were instrumental in helping the Coastal region after hurricane Florence. To make donations please contact USO North Carolina.
- NCServes also provides assistance to veterans with dishonorable discharge status.
- Veterans make a great contribution to our communities. They tend to vote more, donate to charities.
- More comprehensive supports allows veterans transportation to our communities; such as in Union County.
- Veterans Bridge Homes (Three Pillars of Strength)
 - o Jobs: Employment alliance
 - Friends: Veterans Network. Offers social networks for veterans.
 - Resources: Provide a roadmap to resources in the community. Assistance with helping individuals (for example a veteran signing up for Carolina Healthcare.
- The impact on a veteran depends on finding the right person, the right provider for the right service. This involves working with the veteran to help find the right resources based upon what they are looking for.
- Carolina Alliance for Veteran Employment (CAVE)- Local hiring alliance of Human Resources professionals from Carolina companies. There are a total of 176 employers to include a sample the following companies. Novant Health Atrium Health, Bank of America Duke Energy and Wells Fargo. Social capital is so important for our veterans. It is so important to create interconnectivity between veterans.
- NCServes is a coordinated network of private and public resources. Housing and employment are at the top resources requested from our veterans. To date NCServes has service over 4,000 veterans!



 Project 658scheduled to take place on November 7. The event is geared toward creating sustainability between public and private support.
